Food puzzles are an easy way to put that energy to proper use. There are many options for both store bought and homemade food puzzles. KONGs, treat balls, wobblers, and slow bowls are all great options to start out with. You can also repurpose household items such as:

- Tissue Boxes
- Egg Cartons
- Paper Towel Rolls
- Tissue Paper Rolls

- Plastic Bottles
- Paper Bags
- Coffee Trav
- Cereal Boxes

Be sure to supervise your dog to ensure they don't ingest any non-food items!

Use Their Nose

Giving your dog a chance to use their nose is another great enrichment option. This can mean playing games of find the treat around your house, offering them a snuffle mat or providing them with novel dog safe scents like lavender, clove or ginger.
